Building Gateways to Alleviate Poverty

Please join us to hear David K. Shipler talk about alleviating poverty by recognizing and dealing with the multiple interacting problems families have. His book, *The Working Poor: Invisible in America*, was a national best-seller and a finalist for the 2005 National Book Critics Circle Award.

In the 1970s and 1980s Mr. Shipler was a correspondent for *The New York Times* in Saigon, Moscow, and Jerusalem. He won the 1987 Pulitzer Prize for general nonfiction for *Arab and Jew: Wounded Spirits in a Promised Land*. His most recent book, *Rights at Risk: The Limits of Liberty in Today's America*, was published earlier this year.

Mr. Shipler has also taught at Princeton and American University and been a writer-in-residence at the University of Southern California.
